Please continue to shop local and support our Middletown shops and restaurants!



Due to an increase in vehicle thefts, thefts from vehicles, and burglaries, Middletown Police would like to remind you of some things you can do to lessen your chances of being a victim of one of those crimes.

Regarding your vehicle:

• Never leave anything of value (laptops, purses, GPS devices, etc.) in your car.


- Don't leave your vehicle running while unattended.
- Always lock the doors.
- Remove garage door openers from vehicles that are usually parked outside.
- Don't leave keys in your vehicle.
- Don't leave the windows of your vehicle even partially open.
- Park in a well-lit area when possible.
- Never leave a firearm unprotected in your vehicle.

When it comes to protecting your home:

- Keep your garage door closed.
- Ensure the shrubbery around your home is kept in such a way that it reduces the number of places to hide.
- Always lock your doors, including side doors to garages.
- Make your home appear occupied if you aren't there.
- Use deadbolts on exterior doors.
- As you plan vacation, do not post on social media when you are gone.
- Keep the circle of friends and family that know your plans very small.
- Don't leave out things that may tempt a thief such as mowers, bikes, grills, and other items that can be taken.

• If you are a Middletown resident, you can fill out a "Property Watch Form" with the Middletown Police Department. Officers are then aware that you are gone and will check on your property. You can find the form on our website under "services."



MIDDLETOWN RESIDENTS DID YOU KNOW

Kentucky Insurance policyholders often have questions about the taxes that show up on their insurance premium notices. Where does this tax go? A portion of that tax



comes right here to Middletown. The insurance premium tax is an important source of revenue for the local governments even though it is generally one of the least known of all the local taxes. You pay an insurance premium tax on most all of the insurance policies you purchase, auto, home, boat, even your life insurance policies.

Insurance companies are required to pay this premium tax to the city, county or municipality that you live in, like Middletown! The City of Middletown then uses the insurance revenue to keep your City operating, safe and looking beautiful! Your return on this revenue is seen through street lights throughout Middletown, sidewalks, road repair, snow removal, garbage/recycling for residents and 24hr police protection. Without this insurance revenue Middletown would not be able to offer all of the benefits you and I enjoy.

Please contact your insurance agent/broker and make sure they have your insurance policy coded for Middletown so the money goes to Middletown. You have to pay the tax regardless, why not make sure it is coming to the town where you live, work, and play!

A MOMENT IN TIME ...

A SNAPSHOT OF MIDDLETOWN HISTORY

If you have lived in Middletown very long or attended Eastern High School you know the name Reichenbach. Ms. May Belle Reichenbach was a teacher at Eastern High School her entire career. An abbreviated history of her parents life is presented here but you can read the entire story at the Historic Middletown Inc. Museum.

Lena Leuenberger and Herman Reichenbach (both pictured to the right at age 18) met in Louisville and married on September 17, 1910. They became the parents of six children - Richard Herman, Helen Louise, Doris Jean, May Belle, Ruth Elizabeth and William Herbert.

Lena was born in Switzerland on January 26, 1888 and came to the United States with two girlfriends, Lena Loslie and Varina Vorte in 1907.

Herman, who at the age of four years old, immigrated with his parents in the spring of 1881 from Gstaad Switzerland.

Lena came to Louisville because one of her friends had an acquaintance in the city. She roomed in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Bernstein, helping out in their residence.

On September 17, 1910, she and Herman were married at St. Johns Church in Louisville. They lived at 1128 West Broadway, later moving ot 212 South Bayly Avenue and finally in 1917 to a farm in Eastern Jefferson County.

In 1912 they returned to Switzerland for a visit. They had planned on boarding the Titanic in New York when it was to go back to Europe, however the ill-fated ship did not make it across the Atlantic. They sailed on the Ryndam instead.

Herman's family - father Johannes, mother Elizabeth, children Frederick, Elizabeth, John, Charles, Herman and





Ernest settled in Lincoln County Kentucky.

After a career of various jobs Herman retired in 1941 and became a full time farmer on seventy eight acres near Middletown. Herman Reichenbach died on March 9, 1947 and was buried at Resthaven Cemetery. Lena wrote in a letter "March is a very special month to mea month full of memories. I left my home in Switzerland on March 9, 1907. Forty years later on the same date, "Dad" left me for heaven."

In 1984 a series of strokes caused her to be bedridden for more than two years. On September 26, 1986 Lena passed away at the age of 98. When the funeral procession passed the family farm, the cattle and many of the chickens were lined up along the roadside fence as if paying respects to the one who had provided care for them for so many years.


