

Message from the Chief

Spring time is upon us and I hope everyone had a safe and enjoyable winter. I want to reintroduce you to our Crime Tip Line. Just a few short months of this line being in service we have received some useful information that has helped our detectives with cases they are working. I would like to encourage you to call 502-755-4MPD (4673) if you have any information about a crime or know of any suspicious activity that may provide a tip to solving a crime. The information that you provide can be the missing piece to solving a crime and bringing closure to a victim and their family.



I am asking for the public's help in reducing this next trending crime topic.

There has been a marked increase in items stolen from vehicles and even the vehicle

itself. This is a crime that can be prevented, and I am asking for you to do your part. First and foremost, lock your vehicle every time you get out and leave your vehicle unattended. Next, don't leave any valuables in your vehicle. If you need to leave something for a short time, hide the items out of view or store them in your truck. At no time, should you leave a firearm in your vehicle unattended hidden or not. There has been numerous stolen vehicle cases where the owners left a set of keys or a spare set in their vehicle only to have the thieves find the keys and take the vehicle. Adopt a new habit of making sure your vehicle is secure and no items are left inside every night before you retire for the evening. With your help we can reduce or even put a stop to this type of criminal activity in our community.

A common theme that I hear is: I was pulled over by one of your police officers for

minor traffic infraction or your officer stopped me for doing nothing – Don't you guys have anything better to do like fight real crime? 
